Program: Bylaws & Club Assembly

Malcolm M. presented By-laws revisions – lots of criteria:

- conform to current practices
- conform to bylaws of “BIG ROTARY”
- remove outdated content

Board has been working on for about 3 months. Proposed changes sent out on 8/22 – more than 10 days before vote is requirement.

Malcolm highlighted particular changes

- Secretary & Treasurer are to be members
- Membership attendance requirements deleted because not enforced and no longer needed
- Can use voice and written ballots
- Deleted a number of committees (e.g. Attendance, Club Bulletin, Magazine, Membership (now is Membership Development Committee)

Committees now that are actively working:

- Membership Development-includes orientation to new members

- Public Relations
- Finance
- Foundation
- Rotary Foundation

Financial section modified to include putting money in investment accounts in addition to “some bank”

Several other changes made to finance section to reflect what we actually do, e.g. Annual Financial Review; D&O Insurance

How people become members also changed to reflect modern process and actual practice.

- Tom – why reference to classifications still mentioned? (may be a need, left in)
- Tom – page 12, session 2 – reference to “senior active” (will be struck out); those with that current status are grandfathered, also not necessary since attendance requirements were deleted

- Nigeria Peace Corps was once the largest PC country in the world; now many are Rotarians – trying to come up with significant project for Nigeria
