Program - scheduled speaker did not show

Kevin Raymond, Chair, Rotary District Youth Services, pinch hit. Four programs outlined:

1. RYLA – going well, great experience, encouraged us to identify more students (Dover had just 3 last year) and to consider paying for whatever number we reserve, whether or not we have that money. Program has to plan ahead, make expenditures in advance based on those projections.
2. ROTARACT – for people ages 18 – 30, usually in collaboration with an institution of higher ed. Two in our district, UNH and St. Joseph's. Generally sponsored by more than one club.
3. INTERACT – for high school students. New Generations Conference this year will be at York High School – over 200 attended last year. Members had a trip to NYC; Phil & Melissa were chaperones.
4. YOUTH EXCHANGE – on hiatus at the moment, hoping to rebuild. One issue is that as a result of Internet, incoming students no longer disconnect from home, makes the experience quite different.
