Fines: Waiting for Tom D. to return

Program: Peter Johnson - The India Project

Past District Governor, Foundation Chair and Rotary world traveler Peter Johnson began his talk by asking questions. The first question was directed at President Melissa. Why did she become a member of the Paul Harris Society? Members commit to annual donations of \$1,000 to the Rotary Foundation. After her 13 years of experience and travels with Rotary, she said she joined to "give back."

Peter and his Rotarian wife Carolyn Johnson have been giving back in many ways for many years. They just returned from Bangalore, India, to witness how the Dover Rotary Club's donation of \$1,000 last year, coupled with other club donations, resulted in a \$46,000 literacy grant and helped install educational programs and projection systems in 34 rural school buildings for grades 7, 8, 9 and 10.

"These systems are powerful and bring the curriculum to life," he said. In gratitude for the donation, signs with the names of the donating Rotaries are erected in each school and the students and teachers appointed Peter "Crown Prince for a Day." He brought the proof of his princeliness as he donned a silk shawl, elaborate necklace and impressive headgear all while sporting his signature bow tie.

India is a country of dramatic contrasts where 1.2 billion people, speak 16 languages; some students go to excellent private schools and others go to government run schools where students in multiple grades co-exist in as few as two rooms - girls on one side, boys on the other side. Yet, they aspire to learn. Peter noted in other countries he has visited, if students choose to not go to school, nobody cares. In India, students are mandated to attend school through the 10th grade and attendance is strictly monitored. He emphasized the commitment of the 5,500 Rotarians in Bangalore-West who contribute the most of any Rotary district in the world with donations of over \$3 million.

Peter and Carolyn Johnson will soon join Dover Rotary's Interact students on their trip to Guatemala next year.
