Program: ApprenticeshipNH: Liz Arcieri and Delilah Smith

Liz Arcieri introduced Rotarians to ApprenticeshipNH, a workforce training program of the Community College System of NH, funded through a Department of Labor grant. Since 2017 the program has worked with over 100 employers in the state to build registered apprenticeships, helping over 1,000 recipients.

"We help empower specific needs," Liz said citing an example of an auto tech program developed with Dube Ford Toyota. She noted programs are industry led, offer paid jobs, structured learning, supplemental education, diversity, quality and safety and credentials for participants.

Apprenticeships are available for all populations and preapprenticeships are offered for high school students. She thanked the Dover Chamber for its involvement in a project to provide parking for carpentership students from Dover's Career Tech Center traveling to Concord.

Collaborating with employers and community groups, ApprenticeshipsNH offers scholarships and financial
