Membership Minute – Greeter Tally gave us more information on Women in Rotary. Rotary's first woman president was in 1987 from the Rotary Club of Duarte, California, after the club's 11 year battle with Rotary International to admit women. A Representative from RI visited the Duarte Club and reported the female members to RI. The club was then asked to terminate the female members or lose its charter. They wouldn't comply so their charter was revoked. The Club then added a big black X to its Rotary sign and named itself the X-Rotary Club of Duarte. They also took their complaint to court and in 1987, the courts ruled in favor of Duarte. Today, there are 188,000 women members of Rotary.

Last Week's Program:

Our guest speaker was PP Bob Schott. Bob gave us a brief history of the Moxie Gore Paddling Club which was founded in 1992. It became incorporated in 1994 and Bob is currently working on it becoming a 501C3. Bob built a club house in 1997 with the goal of eventually moving it to a permanent site on a slab. As of now, the site has been leveled, stumped and ditched. Through the years, Bob and Lynne have hosted many Rotarians and other groups – GSE teams, Friendship Exchange, Rotary exchange students, Interactors, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts and organizations such as the Wells Rec Dept. With our club's blessing, Bob is applying for some remaining district grant funds to put in a cement pad for the club house so it can be moved to its permanent site. Current DG Carolyn Johnson also wants to make the spring and fall rafting trips as well as the spring ski trip a requirement for the exchange students. It is currently voluntary.
