

<u>Visioning Committee</u> - under the leadership of Committee Chair Patty Rice, the Visioning Committee met at Chris Summers' house last Wednesday, the 24^{th,} to work on our mission statement. The committee had several suggestions and with minor modifications, voted to approve one of them. It will be presented to the club during the Visioning Assembly meeting on October 8th. The rest of the meeting centered on that presentation, what the Visioning committee has accomplished in the last year and goals for next year.

Last Week's Program:

Our guest speaker was Tara Davis from Big Brothers-Big Sisters. She is the chair of the BBBS Advisory Council and has been a Big Sister for 7 years. BBBS was administered by the Child Health Center for many years but when the Center closed at the end of 2010, Community Concepts took over the program and has expanded it into Franklin County as well as Oxford and Androscoggin counties. There are essentially two programs - the Community based program and the School based program. The Community program pairs a Big with a Little and requires a minimum 6 hour per month commitment. Bigs are matched with Littles with similar interests. There is no cost to becoming a Big but if one wanted to take the Little bowling, for example, the Big would have to pay for that. Bigs, however, are discouraged from spending large amounts on their Little for obvious reasons. The School based program matches a high school or college student with their Little and all of their interaction occurs in school during school hours. The commitment for this program is 1 hour per week. Contrary to general opinion, Littles do not necessarily come from broken homes or lower income families. The program is open to any student between the ages of 8 and 14. Last year, there were 210 matches; this year the goal is 300. Unlike other programs, BBBS is totally community funded which means the program receives no outside funding. Bowl-for-Kids-Sake is their largest fund raiser.
