1:00 PM. Donations of men's and children's clothing are their most urgent needs and can be dropped off at The Table the days they are open. They serve 30-60 people each day they are open. They also provide free breakfasts every Saturday at 8:30 AM at the Norway Grange, located at 15 Whitman St. in Norway where they serve 100+ people each week. One of their programs is HOG's (Healthy Outdoor Group) where they offer kayaking from June to September and hiking from October to May. They sponsor LEG's (Ladies Encouragement / Enrichment Group) on Mondays at 6:30 AM at the Square Restaurant in South Paris.
