125 years ago, on October 5, 1892, after terrorizing citizens in Oklahoma, the Dalton Gang rides to Coffeyville, Kansas, and attempts two simultaneous bank robberies. But townspeople recognized the outlaws and surrounded the banks. All gang members except Emmett Dalton were shot and killed. Four citizens also died. Emmett Dalton was convicted and served fourteen years in prison before becoming a writer in Hollywood.
