Last Week:

Susan introduced her guest speaker, Lisa Dunham, from Relay for Life. Relay for Life is the largest fund raiser of the American Cancer Society and there are some big changes coming in for the 2017 Relay. There are 26 different relays in Maine and a lot of them have been in operation for 25 years. Relay implemented a panel to gauge the effectiveness of each relay and as a result made 3 recommendations: close down the smaller ones; institute remote relays; consolidate relays. As a result, the Oxford Hills Relay has been consolidated with Auburn and the Lakes Region (Bridgton area) and will be moving to Poland High School which is a central location and is very visible. The 2017 relay will be on May 13th from noon to 10:00PM. Folks are aiming for it to be the largest in Maine. The largest in Maine last year was in Aroostook County with 400 participants; organizers are hoping for 500 participants in Poland. In addition, volunteer drivers are needed to take cancer patients to doctor's appointments and treatments. If you would like to volunteer, contact Lisa. Relayforlife.com.
