## Last Week:

Prior to the introduction of our guest speaker, <u>President Chris</u> presented <u>AG Beth Abbott</u> with a 13 year perfect attendance award. <u>Lynne Schott</u> was not present but she also has an 11 year perfect attendance award waiting in the wings. Congratulations to Beth and Lynne.

Our guest speakers were Dolfine Gumba Dawa and Pamela Abila, members of the Kavirondo Rotary Club in Kisumu, Kenya. Dolfine is the founder of the Korando Educational Center in Kisumu and where Pamela also has an important role. Dolfine spoke to us in 2008 when she was just starting the orphanage, renamed an educational center. There are over 200 students at the school. Since 2008, there have been many improvements made. They now have running water, new latrines, new cow pens, more animals and a fish pond. With additional land purchases, their farms now encompass 7 acres. Food and irrigation are the largest issues they face as they are trying to be totally self-sufficient. Some of their property borders Lake Victoria and can draw from the lake for irrigation. However, because their fields are not all contiguous, getting the water to the fields is expensive. They are hoping to get a solar powered water pump as electricity to run the pumps they currently have costs \$50 per day per pump, and there are 7 of them. The problem is distance not depth so it will cost upwards of \$150,000.00 for the solar system. Pamela then gave a very interesting power point presentation.

Mary Lou had a sad dollar for the missing dictionaries which hopefully will come in the next few days. She also had a thank you dollar for everyone who helped out during her recovery. Bob was happy that his mother has recovered enough to be getting around with a walker.
