The group left the Fair after lunch and headed to Bob and Lynne's at Moxie Gore. There were 7 students and 5 adults in the group including the exchange student from Russia. They rafted on Saturday and hiked on Sunday before heading home. Tina thanked Ripley & Fletcher Ford for donating the use of a van and, of course, Bob and Lynne for their hosting the weekend.

Announcements:

<u>Bob Schott</u> – had a "jogging" race with one of the students that he says he won by one step. Pretty good for someone his age with a new knee. Speaking of which, past member Linda Earle recently had knee replacement surgery so a get well card for her was circulated.

<u>Dan Allen</u> — would like to start a relief effort for Puerto Rico which was devastated by Hurricane Maria, similar to what we did after the tornado went through Joplin, Missouri, a few years ago. He has some ideas and will be attending the board meeting on October 2 to bring them to the board.

<u>President Chris</u> — the food baskets were donated to the Rowe Elementary School pantry last week. They were very grateful as their cupboards were getting a little bare. It was suggested that Chris announce where the baskets are going ahead of time as it would make a difference in what people bring in for donations, ie: if for children rather than adults. Chris agreed and said he would tell us in the future.

Last week:

Program Chair Louise Campbell led a discussion on our quarterly Visioning review. The Club Size and Membership group led by AG Chris met recently and kicked around many different topics. They have decided to come up with some criteria for a Friends of Rotary membership - both for personal and businesses. The idea being that if we can get some "Friends" involved in our projects, they will see what we do, how much fun we have, and will want to become full members. The Public Relations group now has 4 members, down from the original 7, so they would like to invite anyone who is interested in joining them to come to their next meeting. Patty Rice told us they talked about having a more interactive website and having the ability to sell tickets for events on-line rather than just collecting cash. They also want to work on our web page and Patty has begun by deleting a lot of the old posters, etc. Another suggestion was to have 1 member from each of the other groups on the PR committee which would aid us in coordinating events. George Rice talked about our new fund raiser, "Lobsters for Scholars." One of our goals was to increase the number and dollar amount of our scholarships over the next 5 years, working towards giving ten \$1000 scholarships. This new fund raiser will help us meet that goal. First prize is a lobster dinner for 12 people cooked on site within 50 miles of the Norway-Paris area. Second prize is a \$100 gift certificate from Oxford Casino and third prize is a \$50 gift certificate for lobsters from Smedbergs. VP Pat Cook's group discussed having a Rotary Night (or Day) at the Casino. Usually these events are held on Sundays. In talking with Jack Sours at the Casino, we found that this would have to be coordinated with WOXO and there is some competition for available dates. However, we would not necessarily have to do this during the summer when few dates are available.
