Last Week:

President George led us in the Pledge of Allegiance and the 4-Way Test. AG Chris Summers led us in singing "Jingle Bells" which seemed appropriate given the snow that has fallen over parts of Maine. Glenn Huntley gave the blessing.

<u>Department of Corrections</u> – last week, I said that PP Chris Weston received a President's award for his and the club's efforts in achieving his goals for his Presidential year. Unfortunately, your editor's hearing and brain function not being what it used to be, the award was actually a Foundation Banner Award for achieving our Foundation goals during Chris's presidency. This tied in to George's talking about the Foundation and presentation of a Paul Harris Fellow to Peter Kaurup. Congraulations, Peter!

Glenn Huntley was program chair and his own guest speaker. Glenn was the club's first Polio Plus chair back in 1985 and with the help of past member Dave Carter, put together a cross country ski fund raiser held at Carter's Farm in Oxford. This was the largest fund raiser that the club had attempted to that date and it ran for three years, raising \$1800-\$2400 for each of the three years. Our parent club, Bethel, also helped with the event. In 1988, there were 350,000 + cases of polio in the world; to date in 2018, there are 18 confirmed cases. Jeff Slaton, District Polio Plus Chair, from the Saco Bay club, presented PP Chris Weston with an award for the club's success in donating to Polio Plus during the 2017-2018 year. Oxford Hills was one of 10 clubs in the District to receive the award.
