

Interact News: From Lynne Schott – We are planning the float and need blue and gold ornaments, a Christmas tree, rocking chair and animal costumes, hats and masks,. We will be putting it together at my house on Black Friday, Parade is Saturday. We are registered as OHCHS Interact/Rotary for the judging. The theme is "the Night Before Christmas" so we will have an indoor scene and outdoor animals.

Announcements:

<u>President Chris</u> – as we did last year, the board voted to add approximately \$600 to the money we raised at our last road toll so that we can give a total of \$2000 to the food pantries. The difference this year is that we will not be donating to the Norway and Oxford pantries but to the Progress Center for their dinner program and the Universalist Church for their lunch program. We will still be donating to the West Paris and Otisfield pantries.

** Update** - 11/17 – President Chris contacted the Universalist Church about our donation. They were grateful but did not need additional food. In talking with the Otisfield pantry, Chris found that there were two unrelated food pantries in Otisfield. Therefore the board has decided to donate to the second pantry rather than the Universalist lunch program.

Due to a number of us traveling and getting ready for the holidays and uncertainties about the availability of the church ladies on December 24th and December 31st, we have decided to cancel both meetings at this time.

<u>Ron</u> – Cheese Wheel sales have been going for two weeks. Glenn handed in one sheet last week with 18 sold. We may possibly move the deadline up by one week, to the 3rd of December to give us more time to sell and have "fresher" cheese for people to use as Christmas gifts. Ron will speak to Paul to see if he is available a week later as he and Dawne are planning on heading south for the winter about that time. Ron and Dave are at the Auburn-Lewiston Breakfast Club this morning to try and sell some cheese wheels there.
