It has since evolved to cover all drug related overdoses from opioids as well. The group is concentrating on advocacy and education. September has been designated as National Recovery Month. WMARI sponsors a unified march and rally with food and speakers, marching from the UCC in Norway to Moore Park. WMARI also has Project Save ME which is a community program for anyone struggling with addiction. Anyone who wants, can walk in to any local police or sheriff's office, ask for help and get paired up with a trained recovery coach.
