

<u>Mary Lou</u> – the Dictionary Project will be complete on Friday, October 31<sup>st</sup> as Glenn will be handing out the last dictionaries at the Christian Academy. Mary Lou thanked everyone who helped her and relayed one of the best stories from the presentations. After one of her presentations, Mary Lou was in the hallway of the school talking with one of the teachers when two young ladies from one of the classes came running down the hall to her to tell her they found the longest word on page 279. #### Last Week:

PDG Carolyn Johnson presented a banner to PP Dave Preble for the club in recognition of our contributions to the Foundation and for exceeding the donation goal of \$100 per year per Rotarian. Ours was one of the best clubs in the District with our donations and this was not the first time that we have achieved that level of giving. Carolyn illustrated our consistency of giving by telling us that Nigeria has now been declared Ebola free and the reason for that is because Rotary was there for Polio Plus – we had the means and personnel already there for polio and it was easy for us to mobilize for Ebola treatment and prevention. Our Foundation dollars through a \$100K grant are also helping to build a new 38 bed cancer treatment center.

After the presentation, Pres. Chris brought up the Students of the Month program and a good discussion followed. Val said that it was one of the reasons she joined Rotary back in 1987, so the program has been going on for at least that long. Chris felt that we need to improve the connections between the club and the students and their parents. It was decided that we would have 4 club members take "charge" of each of the 4 students and their guests by assigning them a table and sitting with them.
