Rotary Moment:

Greeter, Foundation Chair and PP George Rice updated us on the Foundation. For the Rotary areas of focus, the most recent statistics available are for the 2021-2022 are: \$104M went to education; \$148M went to community development; \$70M went to disaster relief; \$90M went to maternal and child health; \$67M went to peace; \$187M went to providing clean water and \$33M went to the environment. Remember that contributions from clubs and individuals make up the lion's share of donations to the Foundation. For the 2021-2022 year, our club donated \$11,140.00. In 2022-2023, we donated \$13,280.00, and so far this year, we have sent in \$5,265.00. It all adds up!
