At the conclusion of our annual meeting electing officers, Dan Hart introduced retired Norway Fire Chief, Dennis Yates, as our first Vocational Services speaker for January. Dennis began by saying he had used the 4-Way Test himself, but didn't know where it came from, so was glad to find out where it did. He said he joined the Norway FD on March 5, 1974 and retired from the department on December 30, 2022, almost 49 years of service. Two days after he joined, there was a major fire, his first in action. At that time, the department did not have air packs or much in the way of protective equipment. Firefighters had to buy their own boots, coat, helmet and rubber gloves. The pay was \$2.00 per hour. Now equipment costs \$3,000.00 and must be replaced every 10 years. There are also many more regulations that have to be followed now than there were when Dennis first started and a good part of the chief's time is now devoted to reports and paperwork. There are currently 25 members on the fire department and they participate in working with the schools on fire prevention and also at the high school career day.
