<u>Visiting Rotarians and Guests:</u> We had one visiting Rotarian, AG Sheila Rollins from Bridgton-Lake Region. Jack Sours, Maureen Howard, the Students of the Month and their guests were in attendance.

Last week: President Bob rang the bell and led us in the Pledge. Dan led us in singing "Jingle Bells" and Glenn gave the invocation. After breakfast, Maureen Howard introduced the Students of the Month. President Bob and AG Sheila then talked about the 2013 GSE trip to Nigeria and the changes coming to the program, in that it is becoming a more hands on trip with the team spending all of their time in one place working in their field which in 2013 is special needs education. Related to the GSE trip, President Bob has been working with the other clubs in our Region on a water project for the school the GSE team will be visiting. The school houses 1,000 children and does not have a clean water source. The total cost of the project is \$15,400.00. The District has received a grant for ½ of this and the clubs have to come up with the other half. We can also go outside of our Region to enlist the aid of other clubs who might want to participate.
