Program Chair Ron Morse introduced Kelly Townsend, Program Coordinator and Exercise Specialist at the Medd Medical Building cardiac rehab department. Kelly started the program 21 years ago with one treadmill and one stationary bicycle in a small room in the hospital basement. There were 40 patients participating in the program in 1996; today there are 100 and a lot more equipment to work with. There are 4 stages of treatment – the first is in-patient, getting heart attack patients moving in the hospital before discharge. The second phase is 36 sessions over 12 weeks, starting off slowly and bumping up routines as the patient progresses. The third session is to continue the program at home or pay \$40 per month for three sessions per week, which includes monitoring. The fourth phase allows a patient to use the facility but does not include monitoring. Kelly said that they also do pulmonary treatment.

() Happy Dollars () - [Dan] had 2 happy dollars – one for the Lake Region Community Chorus last weekend and the Christmas for Teens concert at OHCHS this weekend. [Frank] was happy to be here to visit this week and that Connie said "Merry Christmas" to everyone.
