<u>To begin our Vocational Service Month of Programs</u>, our guest speakers were <u>Paul Bickford</u>, Director of the Oxford Hills Technical School and <u>John Williams</u>, Executive Director of the Oxford Hills Chamber of Commerce.

<u>Paul</u> began by thanking us for inviting him to speak. He told us that he is a graduate of Oxford Hills and Harvard College. He has been teaching for 26 years, 23 of which have been right here where he graduated. Prior to accepting his current position, he was a math teacher, guidance counselor and principal of the Oxford Hills Middle School. He is married and has 2 daughters. He had a great support system growing up with education in his blood.

The Tech school offers 19 different technical career educational courses which makes our tech school the 4th largest in the state. The tech school is independent from the high school and has its own school board. However, it receives a lot of support from the school community and administration. It also aligns its offerings with the Maine Community College system so students can get a start on their college education if they choose to go that route. 90% of the students come from SAD #17 and 10% come from Buckfield High School. The program is open to students in the 10th, 11th and 12th grades and in addition to schooling, they offer real work experiences. FMI check out their website at <u>ohts.net</u> or on Facebook.

<u>John Williams</u> also started off by thanking us for having him. He was pleased to announce that Paul (Bickford) has joined the Chamber board and will be attending his first meeting in a few days. John said that he has been associated with the Chamber almost 25 years. He started his career working in broadcast management at different radio stations around the country and that during this time, he started his own company producing programming for radio stations which he continues to do part time to this day. He was Executive Director of the Chamber for many years before taking a break to work on his company, then re-joined the Chamber 11 years ago. There are currently 350 members in 13 different communities. Essentially, the Chamber acts as a facilitator for local businesses, providing support and resources for them. John said that the last year has been a tremendous challenge for small businesses and he wants to make sure that every benefit available is known to members.
