Now, another tornado has devastated Mayfield, Kentucky and many other communities from Arkansas, Missouri and Tennessee. As with the Joplin tornado, Dan has pledged to match the club's donations up to \$1000.00. Dan Allen:

For those who did not hear any news there was a horrible tornado over the weekend.

The history of this club includes our response to another terrible tornado on May 22, 2011, in Joplin Missouri. Around that event the Oxford Hills Rotary went beyond thoughts and prayers

and supporting special relief. We took it personally in a way that others cannot but we could because we are Rotarians.

We found a Rotary club local to Joplin. We asked them to be our "boots on the ground" taking our personal help to people who would otherwise fall through the cracks. In every event like Joplin's and this one that happens for a myriad of reasons. While federal help and FEMA and local and state and more are out there the reality is needs, sometimes desperate ones, sometimes go unmet. It is through Rotary that are privileged to make it personal. Even knowing District 6740 including Mayfair KY, will respond robustly how do we reach individuals?

For Joplin we passed the hat for a few meetings. I remember we offered the opportunity to others to participate as well. This was before the day of Go Fund Me. Speaking to that, here is a chance for us to be positive every penny we raise will to towards the avowed purpose.

I ask for permission from the club for a similar effort. I will match the first \$1000.00 secure in the knowledge this club will readily blow by that amount. I propose that the board consider the board's response to this and perhaps join in these individual efforts. Thank you, Dan

The loss of life in many small towns is heartbreaking, and survivors have lost their communities, their homes and livelihoods. In many areas, electricity, food, gasoline, supplies and medical services are limited or unavailable
