Most of the animals she takes in are brought to her by game wardens. She cannot ask for donations, they must be all voluntary. She said she handles primarily with deer, raccoons and squirrels. Kristina does not take in birds. There is a rehabber in Bridgton that takes them. In fact, there are several rehabbers around that specialize in different animals so they are in constant contact among themselves and with the game wardens. Kristina did most of her program in response to our questions and it was very interesting to hear.
