We held a <u>Fireside Chat</u> on Wednesday evening, December 30<sup>th</sup>, for Mike Morin and Phyllis Summers. At the conclusion of the Chat, Phyllis was inducted as our newest member. Congratulations, Phyllis, and welcome to Oxford Hills Rotary. We are looking forward to seeing you again this coming summer.

**Foundation Chair George Rice** would like to remind everyone to continue sending him your Happy Dollars. Donations are down compared to last year, probably the result of not having in-person meetings. It's easy to have Happy Dollars on Zoom but we have to remember to send him the money. You can send donations to our PO Box, to George directly or drop them off with Treasurer Liz Knox at the South Paris Town Office.

For our program, Tally asked us to think about two questions and through the miracle of Zoom, Tina divided us into 4 groups of 5 to independently discuss these questions and assign a spokesperson to tell the group.

#### Question 1: What should we continue to do and why?

<u>Group 1 –</u> enhance our efforts with the food banks, more involvement with Norway and Harrison; have more structured meetings and programs.

<u>Group 2 –</u> continue working with the Progress Center when they resume their food pantry and community dinner; continue working with the food banks, particularly the ones in the schools; continue with the Student of the Month program; promote tent rentals; need younger members to help with auction

<u>Group 3 –</u> continue working with the Progress Center; distribute food baskets; do something to bring the community together, perhaps have an outdoor dance on a summer evening; something for Veterans.

<u>Group 4 –</u> continue with the Lobster Drive-through, maybe do 2 a year and bring in other elements, such as a lobster roll or barbecue chicken. Also continue with tent rentals, auction and more community activities such as the cemetery clean up.

#### Question 2: What would you like us to pursue in the coming year?

<u>Group 1 – perhaps use our unclaimed scholarship funds to support kids in other ways such as vocational education; help support covid vaccinations in readiness and distribution; do another hands on community project such as the work we did on Riverside Cemetery or roadside trash pick-up; lastly, promote Robert's Farm activities for little kids – maybe in conjunction with May Day Play Day or something like that.</u>

<u>Group 2 –</u> continue with the auction but in a different format, perhaps secure the use of one of the buildings at the fairgrounds so we don't have to move multiple times; continue to do the Lobster Fest as a drive through; start cheese wheel sales earlier.

<u>Group 3 –</u> perhaps increase funds to continue to support the food pantries; do something for Veterans; a community dance; help with vaccine clinics.

<u>Group 4 –</u> adopt a cemetery as a community project; adopt a road; do something fun for ourselves such as going bowling, a potluck dinner or summer social; perhaps do 2 lobster drive-throughs or do lobster rolls and chicken.
