Snow weight and depths.

6" = 7.5 pounds per sq ft.

12 " = 16.1 psf

 $18'' = 26.1 \, psf$

24" = 37.8 psf

30" = 51.8 psf

36'' = 69 psf

 So if you have rain on top of that, the weight can easily double or even triple. Keep snow levels to a minimum, but never, ever shovel down to the shingles or metal where damage can be done. Always leave at least 3" of snow.
