<u>Visiting Rotarians and Guests:</u> There were no visiting Rotarians last week. Our guests were the February Students of the Month and their parents.

Rotary Moment: Greeter Dan Hart gave us some information he found in the Rotarian magazine. The Rotary Club of Poipu Beach, Hawaii has teamed up with the Rotary Club of Pursat, Cambodia to assist sustainable Cambodia, paying \$6,000.00 for construction of a pre-school building, nutrition

programs and part of a teacher salary in rural Pursat. On a visit in June 2017 to deliver school supplies and recreational gear, Craig Nishimoto, a veterinarian and past president of the Poipu Beach Club, also vaccinated about 40 dogs against rabies. "In Cambodia, they don't vaccinate their pets for rabies," said Nishimoto. Vaccinating dogs also protects people.
