<u>President Chris</u> - we received a certificate of thanks from the Dictionary Project which Chris presented to Mary Lou. We donated \$660 for dictionaries last year. Cumulatively, the Dictionary Project has given

dictionaries to 24,251,431 students of which 2,904 were given out by OH Rotary. Last year, the Dictionary project gave out 1,983,412 dictionaries to 3rd grade students.

We also received a thank-you note from <u>Luke Davidson</u>, one of our scholarship recipients last year.

We are making progress on the *St. Patrick's Day Luncheon* at the Progress Center for senior citizens (55 and older). We will be placing advertisements in the paper as well as placing posters in local businesses. The lunch is by reservation only to the first 100 people that call in to TD Bank which is handling the reservations for us. We will only need 4-6 Rotarians to help out so if you are interested, speak to Ron Morse.

Our new *placemats* have been ordered and should be ready for this weeks' meeting.

Ron Morse talked about the food baskets we will be distributing after today's meeting. We will be giving out 20 baskets worth \$50 each. We must have teams of 2 and Ron would like 10 volunteers.

Patty Rice reported that as of yesterday afternoon, our new Facebook page is up and running. Patty invited all OH Rotarians on her personal friends' list to like the page and share it with our friends to get the word out. As of last Wednesday morning, we have 67 likes which is more than double our membership.

Looking for something community oriented to do in retirement, he started volunteering at the Elm Street School in Mechanic Falls reading to the kids one day per week. That soon evolved into two or three days and eventually, the kids were reading to him. He said the kids are really excited to participate and he enjoys talking to them about their reading material as they enjoy telling him about what they learn. He has gotten members of the Brunswick Coastal club to go to the Coffin School in Brunswick every week and is trying to get more Rotary clubs to participate in their communities.
