Rick started off by telling us that he had deep connections to the Oxford Hills. His aunt and uncle owned the Bryant Pond Telephone Company, and as we all remember, the switchboard was in their living room. Rick said that his mother was one of the operators. After attending Harvard, Rick decided to come back to the Oxford Hills. It took him a while to find his niche – he started a small newspaper with a friend that ultimately was unsuccessful. He then worked for Burlington Homes. In 1994, he ran for Congress, won the Republican primary, but lost to John Baldacci. He then made a run for the State Senate in 1996, serving four terms, including serving as Senate President. After getting his MBA in the late 90's, he became good friends with Bob Monks, a well-known individual in community service and Republican politics. Bob was instrumental in getting Rick involved in the fields of corporate power and accountability. They started a company focusing on these areas and became the first activist corporation in the US. Ultimately, they sold this company to a financial services company, but Rick kept the consulting part of the business, working with shareholders. He said that he likes "to fix broken things" and that accountability needs to be aligned with the people being served. It was a very interesting talk and I have only touched the surface here.

At the conclusion of our meeting, *Foundation Chair George Rice* presented Co-President Peter Kaurup with his PH+5 pin and Becky Kaurup with her PH+4 pin. Congratulations to Peter and Becky!
