Beth also took 1000 adult/100 kids, some of which went to the Pink Feather Foundation; we gave 400 to First Congregational Church, 300 to the Norway PD, 300 to the Norway FD, 300 to the Paris FD, 300 to the Paris Library and 300 to the Cancer Resource Center.

We are working on putting together a community clean-up service project for Earth Day on Thursday, April 22 as well as a second clean-up on Saturday, April 24. More details to come.

Bonnie's talk was on the Covid vaccine program. She gave us the background of how the hospital went about setting up to give tests and vaccines but how they have been hampered by the limited amount of vaccine available. They continue to hope that more vaccine will be released. Initially, the Maine Health system was overwhelmed by the volume of calls they received, some 70,000 calls the first day the program was put into place. This, of course, caused a tremendous back log of people looking for appointments when again, there was a limited amount of vaccine available. Over time, the vaccine supply has increased and the volume of calls has become more manageable. On the positive side, the vaccination clinics are happy places to be. Everyone, from the nurses to the volunteers feel really good about finally being able to help.
