Timothy A. Churchill, President and CEO of Western Maine Health Care and Deborah Deatrick, MPH Senior Vicepresident, Community Health of MaineHealth, spoke about initiatives of their respective employers in concert with the Oxford County Wellness Collaborative. OCWC was formed in response to the <u>County Health Rankings &</u> Roadmaps program's ranking of Oxford County. CHRR is a collaboration between the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation and the University of Wisconsin Population Health Institute. CHRR found Oxford County to be 16th out of 16 counties in Maine in terms of overall health during the first year of the program in 2010. As of 2014, Oxford County had improved its position through various efforts and is now ranked 10th in the state. Among efforts involving both country hospitals, Stephen's Memorial and Rumford Community, both have taken active roles in their respective communities to improve overall health from a proactive standpoint rather than simply reacting to sickness and injuries which is the normal approach of health care providers. The focus here in Oxford Hills has been through Healthy Oxford Hills, an integral program and part of Western Maine Healthcare.
