Some of the programs include: day services at the Progress Center campus on Cottage Street for about 35 adults; three residential homes located in Norway and Paris; support for disabled consumers living at home; various types of support for about 80 other people over a four county region; a community kitchen serving Thursday evening meals for 160-170 people each week and the wood shop which creates consumer assisted wood products.
