As we now know, due to the Coronavirus, our meetings and events have been cancelled until further notice, now through April at a minimum.

Last Week:

We had our first Zoom meeting on Thursday morning at 7:30 AM. Members participating were Curtis, Liz, Stan, Tally, Lynne, Beth, Patty, George, Dan (not noted if it was Dan Allen or Dan Hart), Tina, Val, Dave, Peter, Becky, Chris, Bob and Frank. Lois was a participating guest.

We said the Pledge of Allegiance, the 4 Way Test and clarified the use of Zoom.

1. From the **Board**, at this time, we are not asking as a club to deliver food, but you are certainly welcome to do so on your own if you would like to help

- 2. <u>Peter</u> volunteered with the Bridgton Rotary at the Harrison Food Bank. There were 100 cars lined up to receive food hour early. The process was very smooth and sanitary and Peter had deliveries to West Paris and South Paris. He feels the numbers will double next week. There were 7 members from the Bridgton Club including him and 1 from Portland helping.
- 3. **Patty** is going to check with OHCHS to request the use of the building for the Auction in July and the Lobster Feed in August if they are currently accepting such requests.
- 4. <u>Patty</u> also brought up the Scholarship applications. We currently have 7 that have been handed in and we are extending the deadline. Tina said she would follow up with the guidance teachers and get back to us with a firm deadline.
- 5. <u>Beth</u> will be phoning the food banks to see what is needed for help, if they are open or how they are getting food out.
- 6. <u>Liz</u> told us that the Paris PD is delivering food and they have connected with elderly couples to get food to them.
- 7. It was stated that we need to look at helping the people who are unemployed with food and supplies.
- 8. <u>Tina</u> said she would check with the Oxford PD to see if they are doing similar deliveries in Oxford and Otisfield.
- 9. <u>Peter</u> told us that Daddy O's is working with the Congo Church (not noted if 1st of 2nd) to put on a food bank in Daddy O's lobby, take what you need or leave food to help. Tally said that Daddy O's gave out 100 meals on Friday and Beth added that they were gone in 10 minutes, so there is a great need. It was suggested that we allocate \$1500 to help with this venture. Beth is going to follow up with them. Bob suggested presenting a check to Daddy O's for this.
- 10. <u>Dan H.</u> talked to Erica Lindstom of Healthy Oxford Hills. She is preparing a 5 year/\$500,000 grant for youth tobacco use prevention and education and that they need civic volunteers to sit on a board of 12. Dan said he would step up and be on that board. Tina added that Erica is an alumnus of OHCHS.
- 11. <u>Stan</u> asked for George Campbell's contact information because he is interested in purchasing one of our older retired tents.
- 12. <u>Val</u> asked about auction items. Paul and Curtis will still pick up items and there is currently room in storage. We cannot solicit businesses that have been shut down from this epidemic so right now we will just be collecting furniture and such.

- 13. We have 2 cheese wheels left. Lois is getting one and Beth has one left at her house if anyone is interested.
- 14. *Ocean State Job Lots* is handing out material to make face masks if anyone wants to make some.
- 15. **Bedard Farms** by Save-a-Lot has masks available for \$5. You need to call ahead and they will bring your order to your car.
- 16. <u>Chris S</u>. talked with Mary Ann Brown and they are postponing the dance. They do not want to push it out to fall automatically because there are other events planned for fall. Beth pointed out that the Special Olympics athletes don't compete until fall and winter so we can support them directly as well.
- 17. <u>Tally</u> and <u>Lois</u> asked for an updated phone list. Patty said she would prepare a new club directory and send it out (which she has done).

There was a discussion on a short term vision for our Zoom meetings. We need to encourage others to join in next week as it was great to see everyone. The safeguards that have been put in place will hopefully make people feel secure with Zoom.
