<u>CoPE Peter</u> sent me an e-mail with updated plans for our Earth Day clean-up. He visited both Moore Park and the Cornwall Preserve on Saturday and then met with Liz.

"Cornwall's dirt parking area is in desperate need of grading and it's virtually impossible for more than three cars to park there right now. Luckily there's only a need for litter pick-up around the parking lot / entrance. I can do so myself in about an hour and will complete this before Wednesday. The trails are in good shape so there is nothing for our group to do there right now."

"As for Moore Park on Saturday (the 24th) we'll be working from 9:00 AM until noon. Members are encouraged to bring drinking water, rakes, hand clippers, work gloves and kneeling pads. Wheelbarrows would also be appreciated if members can transport them. The Town of Paris will provide us with trash bags but most of our clean-up will involve raking, cleaning out flower gardens and the playground area of dead leaves. We will also be evaluating the condition of the gazebo for repair and painting by our group in the near future."

Regarding the Bridgton-Lake Region clean-up day, Thursday, April 22nd – They will be working from 9:30 AM until 1::00 PM for clean-up and lunch. They are partnering with the BCC Community and Loon Echo Land Trust to clean the grounds at the Community Center, along Depot St. and into Pondicherry Park. Bring work gloves and probably a rake. <u>Dan H.</u> sent an e-mail to scholarship committee members last Friday. It looks like we have 18 scholarship applications to review. The scholarship committee will be meeting in mid-May to review the applications and decide on the recipients.

Last Week:

We had our first in-person meeting at the church for the first time in almost 6 months while there were 5 or 6 others attending via Zoom. President Lynne led us in the Pledge and 4-Way Test. Dan Allen gave the blessing.

After breakfast, we went right to our guest speakers, Paris Police Chief Mike Dailey and Detective Nicholas Gilbert who talked about the drug and opioid crisis in Oxford Hills. Both told us that there has been a huge increase in drug use since the pandemic began, and even before then, they were beginning to see an increase in methamphetamines. Doctors have been cracking down on prescriptions so users are focusing on the cheaper drugs. The Paris PD is receiving 3-4 calls per week for drug overdoses. Police and medical professionals are doing what they can and try to interact with users in a positive manner to get them some help, but they have a very small window of time once the person is transported. Covid has also interfered with the ability of police to arrest and detain. Jails don't want people so most are released with conditions. Most other crimes such as burglary come back to drug use and many drug issues are the results of family conditions. If mom and dad are users, their kids are, too. One last point was that state programs are severely lacking in support for these situations.
