Last Week:

We had our second Zoom meeting on Thursday morning at 7:30 AM. Members participating were: Becky, Peter, Beth, Stan, Jen, Dave, Dan A., Dan H., Val, Chris W., Chris S., Curtis, Bob, Lynne, Paul, Liz and Tina. Lois was our guest once again. The meeting was called to order at 7:32 AM.

 Beth gave us an update on the food pantries and made some recommendations which were approved by the board. We will be donating \$1,000.00 to the 1st Congregational Church minister's discretionary fund, \$500.00 to the Town of Paris for food deliveries, \$500.00 to the Oxford Hills food pantry and \$500.00 to the Harrison food pantry for fuel for refrigeration they are using for food. These donations total \$2,500.00 from the approved budget of \$4,500.00, thus leaving us \$2,000.00 for future needs.

- 2. Peter told us that the Harrison pantry has been overwhelmed. He updated the dates for pick-up and delivery. The pantry will be open for pick-up on Tuesday. Wednesday will be delivery day. Sandy or Sheila from Harrison will e-mail the delivery people on Monday with the list of people to contact for delivery. Dan Hart also delivered last week as well. He offered to be our contact if anyone else wants to volunteer. Beth said the pantry needs a box truck for storage. Theirs is getting too old to repair. Dan A. said he would check with Hancock Lumber to see if they can donate a truck. He will follow up with Beth and get contact info for Sandy and Sheila.
- 3. Tina said she would follow up with the Oxford PD to see if they need support. At this time, they are also supporting the Paris PD.
- 4. The Scholarship committee has extended the deadline for the return of applications until May 15th, a month later than usual. Tina will contact the guidance people and follow up with them. Dan H. is planning a meeting for the scholarship committee on May 21st which will include Dan, Tina, Tally, John, Miranda and Abbie.
- 5. Beth announced that Bancroft lost two trucks in the explosion at the Jay paper mill. No one was hurt but the two trucks are a total loss.
- 6. Tina asked if we can post our address in the minutes for Happy Dollars and any other correspondence. (*The address has always been at the top of the first page of the Reader and I posted it after Happy Dollars as well last week, ed.*)

Beth said she would check with Patty but thought Patty wouldn't mind if we dropped off checks in a box just inside the door at Austin Associates if we were going by.

- 7. Peter said that the E-club is having difficulties getting organized because of the current situation, but Portland Sunrise and Bath are looking at becoming the official sponsor for the club. At their Zoom meeting, Sandy Sweat spoke to 8 or 9 participants.
- 8. Tina announced that RYLA has been cancelled and the Interact Conference has been rescheduled to November 21, 2020 at Dover, NH high school. Also, because of continued uncertainty, the trip to NY in the fall has also been cancelled.
- 9. Students of the Month will still be selected and Tina will share their information at our next meeting if she is able.
- 10. Paul said that he will send out an e-mail on the pros and cons of having the Auction this year for us to discuss at our next meeting.

- 11. Stan is keeping attendance for the Zoom meetings as they are regularly scheduled meetings.
- 12. Chris S. told us that Mary Helman is holding a Zoom meeting on club growth on Saturday, the 18th and we all got an e-mail on that.
- 13. Lastly, Tina shared a video from the high school that went out to students.
