Last Week:

Chris Weston introduced Frank Damon, retired Air Force Master Sergeant. Frank, a Waterford native and OHCHS graduate spent 20 years in the service, the last 8 years of which he was assigned to Air Force One [AF1]. Frank's title was Production Supervisor which meant he was responsible for equipment and supplies incident to those items and other extra-aircraft details that makes the Boeing 747 plane AF1. The government owns and maintains two identical AF1s. Frank still has what amounts to about 10 items of classified knowledge he cannot mention. What he did tell us were normal stories about their missions, movement about the plane, personnel and interesting stories concerning both presidents he served under: Trump and Obama. He said Trump was a much more hands on boss than Obama and that he was forewarned to always be prepared for questions from Trump at a moment's notice, and usually in person. That prediction was true. He also said Trump likes fast food and would order 100 Big Macs be brought aboard AF1 for a trip whereas Obama would want more high-end food prepared in the plane's galley. AF1 historically has a 100% on-time record for all flights and that nothing short of 100% is the goal for everything else related to AF1. Frank is currently a permanent volunteer at the high school mentoring 50 freshmen students. He says it takes about 5 to 8 hours per month and would recommend it to anyone interested. It is the high school's goal to have 100% of the students enrolled in the mentoring program within the next three years.
