Despite the pandemic and meeting on Zoom for most of last year and so far this year, clubs have continued to carry on, doing the best they can to support their projects, their communities and each other during this most difficult time. By using bubbles, if one person becomes ill, only that person's bubble will be affected – not the other 3. RYLA will be Sunday through Wednesday, the 27th-30th of June. There will also be a virtual District Conference the evening of Friday June 4th from 6:30 PM to 8:00 PM and on Saturday morning, June 5th from 9:00 AM to 11:30 AM.
