May Students of the Month

Moral Courage: Students demonstrate the willingness to do what's right despite the unpleasant consequences that may follow.

9th grade – Emily Hatch, nominated by her Essential Skills Development and Social Studies teachers.

"Emily has stayed after school to improve her algebra skills throughout the year. She demonstrates a willingness to provide positive behaviors when other students in class are behaving negatively. She does what is asked without question and without worrying about what her peers think."

"Emily is quick to begin and complete assignments. She has prioritized her education and has even apologized to me if another student is treating me disrespectfully. I can always count on Emily!"

"Emily is always trying to improve on her work. She does not settle for "good enough" but works hard to achieve the highest possible success both inside and outside of class. She is consistent and dependable, demonstrating a stable and honest work ethic."

10th grade – Morgan Linfield, nominated by her Military History teacher.

"Morgan does not hesitate to speak up for the "underdog" or what is right. She doesn't tolerate hate speech or bullying. She asks probing questions to understand why someone may have said what they did and tries her hardest to be tolerant of opposing perspectives. She has questioned and stopped people in the hallway for using derogatory or inappropriate language."

"In the lunch room, Morgan heard a group of guys behind her joking around about being autistic. Morgan stood up and spoke to them about the inappropriateness and offensiveness of their comments. These boys were upper-class students. Morgan didn't know them, she just knew what they were saying wasn't right."

11th grade – Hannah Smith, nominated by the OHCHS Secretary

"Hannah has always stood up for what she feels is right. When Hannah sees something bad happening to a person or group she feels is being wrongly targeted, she will stand up for them. She is a strong woman who is not afraid to take anything on."

"Hannah enjoys helping people. Hannah makes sure other students in our school have the things they need to succeed and to make the students feel special and that they belong."

12th grade – Mitchell Lisowski, nominated by his Key Club Advisor

"Mitchell is constantly showing moral courage by taking on a lot of activities and being willing to put a lot of effort into all of them. He doesn't just go with the flow, but is willing to stand up and do what he thinks is best for those around him. He is comfortable with taking risks."

"At the Key Club convention last month, Mitchell made the choice not to go to the dances because he knew there was inappropriate behavior occurring. He also encouraged his peers to make good choices and made sure no one was left out of activities."
