Guest Speaker - Dr. Bob Kahn introduced our guest speaker, Barry Patrie, Business Counselor for SCORE. Barry said he had been trying to get before us for several months and was glad to be here this morning. He lives in North Waterford where he retired after 30 years of consulting engineering in Portland. Not happy with retirement, he and his wife purchased the Wicked Good Store in Waterford and ran it for 7 years before retiring a second time. Again finding retirement not for him, he taught high school math for 5 years before retiring a 3rd time. Two years ago, he joined SCORE as a consultant/mentor. The National SCORE was started in 1964 with our local chapter forming in the early 1980's. There are currently 33 mentors who volunteer in South Paris while there are 13,000 mentors nationwide who help 400,000 people annually. SCORE is financed through and works with the SBA in addition to working with local agencies such as Community Concepts. They provide new and existing businesses with direct advice and

counseling in banking, sales, accounting, real estate, insurance, business plans and marketing among others. They also have round table discussions at the Norway Town office, conduct workshops with speakers talking about business and social media, constant contact and Quick books. They assist start- ups with business plans, cash flow projections and other services. The South Paris office is open 5 days per week from 9AM – 12PM.
