Everest for Polio, Bob Crowley, Maine's own "Survivor" and some of the First Responders to the Lac Megantic tragedy.

Irina introduced her guest speaker, Rick Bader. Rick is a local artist and physical therapist. S.O.U.L. stands for Supporting Opportunities for Ugandans to Learn. It was started 5 years ago by Brook and her father, Rick. After graduating from college, Brook was looking for an opportunity to make a difference in people's lives and she happened on a school for the deaf and blind in Bujagili Falls, Uganda. By bringing education and free enterprise to the area, the Foundation now provides daily hot lunches for 500 school children, training for women in tailoring, raising chickens and creating fish farms among other things. The idea is that people don't want handouts, they want help to get started and by working together, the Foundation and the village have met with great success.
