Our guest speaker was Lee Dassler, Executive Director of Western Foothills Land Trust. The land trust is 32 years old. It owns 3,000 acres of land and protects 700 acres. They have 30 miles of trails at six different preserves. They are currently working on a campus for Robert's Farm Preserve, a building that will have a meeting space, kid's facility, kitchen, bathroom and office. On Saturday and Sunday during the winter, they provide a warming hut, skis and snowshoes. In addition, there are mountain biking trails, hiking trails, skiing, snowshoeing, a biathalon, bird watching and more. They are currently in need of volunteers for the biathalon.

Future plans include enlarging Roberts Farm Preserve with an extra 47 acres that would be along the woods line by Norway Lake on the same side as Roberts Farm. All of that land will be protected forest

with trails. The Preserve is also purchasing additional land on Water Street with a goal of extending trails from downtown to Robert's Farm.

At the conclusion of Lee's talk, we presented Lee with a check from OH Rotary as a donation to the Western Foothills Land Trust.
