#### Last Week:

<u>Greeter Mike Morin</u> led is in the Pledge and 4-Way Test and <u>President Lynne</u> gave the blessing.

<u>We began our Club Assembly with DG Peggy Belanger</u> who gave a brief talk about this year's theme and how it relates to Rotary opening doors – that we are open to all, that open doors expand our abilities and that our doors are always open to new members. We also need to remember that while we are looking for new members to help us, we don't want to forget to let them know that we can help them.

Peggy also talked about the on-line virtual District Conference scheduled for Friday evening, June 4 and Saturday morning, June 5. There will be an on-line auction, I believe she said, beginning May 18. There is a \$20 fee for the Conference which will be donated to Polio Plus.

At the end of her talk, Beth came forward and presented Peggy with her Paul Harris +4 pin. It seems that our \$100 donation to the Foundation in Peggy's name put her over the top for the +4.

<u>Beth</u> told us that the Pink Feather Foundation completed their move last weekend. They had numerous volunteers and I believe she said moved five truckloads of clothing.

<u>AG Chris</u> announced that he will be ordering another round of Rotary t-shirts, so see Chris if you want to order a replacement or extra shirt.

<u>COPE Peter</u> told us that the board approved the revised by-laws at the board meeting Monday evening. Liz Knox e-mailed a copy to everyone for them to review. We will be voting on these by-laws this week.

<u>PP George</u> reminded us that we need to get back in the habit of entering our volunteer hours in the note book. Some members e-mail their hours to George every month but those that don't need to be sure to keep up to date by entering them weekly now that we are back to in-person meetings.

Lastly, <u>Stan</u> gave us an updated classification talk. Stan was born and brought up in Otisfield. He graduated from high school in 1968, attended college and did carpentry work until 1972. This new organization supports the families of the students as well as the student which this additional amount will go to.

The board also voted to continue our support of Gardener's Growing Healthy Communities with a \$200 donation. This is the third year we have donated to this group.

<u>Treasurer Liz</u> will be sending out 2021-2022 dues notices by the end of May. Dues are due by June 30 so we can make sure we have an updated club roster for our national and district dues on July 1.
