Rotary Moment: Val mentioned in her Rotary Moment that she and 6 other club members attended the five district conference last weekend at the Mt. Washington Hotel complex. There were over 600

Rotarians in attendance. Those attending from our club were Chris and Val Weston, AG Chris Summers, George and Patty Rice, and Pat and Bruce Cook.

Announcements:

<u>PE/PDG/PP George Rice</u> – brought our attention to the large display poster in the back of the room which was displayed at the District Conference depicting the various phases and scenes of the club's tree planting project two weeks past. He also told us that he would be bringing Lobsters for Scholars raffle tickets next week for our second raffle of a private Lobster Fest for the winner and guests. The drawing will be held on June 13.

<u>AG Chris Summers</u> – told us that a debriefing and summary of the Ray Brown Dance would be held and that the details would then be reported to the club on the 16th. He said he was pleased to finally meet Preb's brother, Pete Preble, who is president of the Auburn Breakfast Club this year and was at the District Conference.
