First she told us a story about a woman who has cancer whose bathroom needed some work. She needed the floor replaced under the commode and needed a new commode as well. Diane called Paul Thornfeldt for help, Paul called Dave Preble and within an hour, they came up with a commode for the woman. Diane said it was nice that we can all collaborate when there is a need.

Diane said that before Covid, the Resource Center was more or less a drop in kind of place. With Covid, they had to convert all of their programs to a virtual meetings. While they are still not open, they plan to start offering meditation and Yoga classes three times per week. They also hired a social worker with a grant they received from the Maine Cancer Foundation who has been a big help giving emotional support to cancer patients in the Oxford Hills and surrounding towns. Diane told us that they have started working with all the cancer centers in Maine and that they have formed an association to better serve their communities. After all, they are all working for the same goals. To further support their programs, they will be holding a golf tournament in September and plan to continue with their Turkey Trot on Thanksgiving. Both of these events have been good fundraisers. And always, people have been helping with rides, quilts and wigs.
