Mike Dignan, South Paris Librarian for the past 22 years spoke about the former Deering Memorial church building and its form and function as a community center. The library was given the building in early 2017 after the Methodist congregation disbanded.

Mike talked about the history and age of the building, saying it needed a new roof so that the use of the upstairs former sanctuary could be extended to four season use, due to it needing insulation. The building is currently used for meetings and is available for use hourly or daily for a reasonable donation. It is also used to house the library children's programs and is a much better location for that purpose rather than the basement of the library itself.

The library is pleased to now own the former church which is directly adjacent to the library. They recognize, however, that the library has a lot of work to do to raise the \$180,000.00 necessary to do what has already been identified to properly maintain the building. They are hoping to qualify for grants and local donations to complete the process.
