### Last week's program:

George and Patty Rice talked about their trip to the International Convention in Sydney, Australia. It took them approximately 35 hours to make the trip, both over and back. Coming home, they left Sydney at 11:00 AM on Monday morning (Australian time) and they were home in South Paris just about midnight Monday (our time). On the way to Australia at their airport stops, they met many other Rotarians on their way to the convention. There were 18,000 Rotarians registered for the Convention. Because there were so many attending, there were two opening plenary sessions, one in the morning, another in the afternoon. George and Patty attended the morning session with about 11,000 other Rotarians. They stayed at a Sheraton in Darling Harbor, across from Sydney Harbor which turned out to be very convenient with a short train, bus or ferry ride into Sydney. Local transportation was free to Rotarians per the Australian government; all they had to do was show their badge. They both climbed the Sydney Harbor Bridge which took four hours up and down. Patty said it was not as physically challenging as she expected but unfortunately, it rained the day they made their climb. When they got back to the bridge lobby after climbing, they met RI President Ron Burton getting ready to make his 5<sup>th</sup> climb. The government donated 50% of the proceeds from the bridge admission from Rotarians back to Rotary which was \$40,000.00 +. The Australian Prime Minister also pledged \$100,000,000.00 from Australia to polio eradication.
