Rotary Moment:

Val talked about Roto-plast which was founded in 1992. It was started in order to facilitate a surgical program in Chile to repair cleft palates in children with the first surgeries performed in January 1993. Since then the program has expanded all over the world and over 15,000 children have been served. Ellie Andrews from the Bridgton club was part of the last trip and talked about her experience at last month's District Conference.

Last Week:

After welcoming everyone, President Dave led us in the Pledge, Dan led us in singing "God Bless Our Rotary" and also offered the blessing.

After breakfast and the announcements, Dave turned the program over to our program chair for the morning, Ron Morse. Ron introduced Mody Botros and Emma Bodwell from the Bridgton-Lake Region Rotary Club who talked about their clubs international project in Imolongo, Magwi, South Sudan. This project began 4 years ago when the club connected with a young man from South Sudan who came to the US with literally nothing. He was a determined young man who earned his GED, a Bachelor's degree and a Master's degree in economics. All along, his goal was to go back to South Sudan and help his village. The program began with an exchange of guns for soccer balls, sneakers and books with an initial shipment of 200 pairs of sneakers and 500 books. There was also a tremendous need for clean water and this initial project led to Bridgton-Lake Region giving \$3000 for a generator to power a well pump. They did purchase a generator but used the majority of the money to build a school because as they were told, "generators don't cost \$3000 in Sudan." This school is the only brick and mortar building in the county and its construction has led to many more good things for the village. Bridgton-Lake Region is looking for support from other clubs in the district to help them build on what they have started and provide for the growth and sustainability of their project.
