Visiting Rotarians and Guests:

Lois Strauss was our only visiting Rotarian. There were no other guests.

Rotary Moment:

Greeter and club Secretary, John Griffith gave his annual update on the Club. As of June 2020, we had 29 members. As of June 2021, we are at 33, a net gain of 4. Our average attendance, including 102 makeups, is 80.45%. Our lowest membership attendance was 17 on July 2, 2020 and our highest was 28 members on January 6, 2021. During the 2019-2020 year, we had two months with 100% attendance, so we are lagging a bit this year. 48% of our members have been Rotarians for more than 20 years; 12% have been members for 10-20 years; 6% have been members for 5-10 years; 33% have been members for 1-5 years and 1% have been members for less than 1 year. We are 45% female and 55% male. 2 members, 5.7% of us are under 29 years old; none of us are between 30-39; 1 member, 2.9% of us is between 40-49; 5 members, 14.3% are between 50-59; 9 members, 25.7% are between 60-69: 13 members, 37.1%, are 70 and older. 3 members, 8.6% have not disclosed their age. Based on the above, our average age is 64 which is up from 62 last year. Lastly, 4 members have never logged in to Club Runner.

We had a wonderful **Rotarian of the Year** gathering at Peter and Becky Kaurup's last Saturday. The weather forecast was "iffy" with scattered thunderstorms possible but except for one brief period of dark clouds and a few sprinkles, the weather could not have been better. And what could be better than an outdoor potluck meal. There was very little left over. **Congratulations to Dan Hart** on becoming Rotarian of the Year for 2020. Dan has put his heart and soul into our club these last couple of years,

leading the Membership committee, the Scholarship committee, serving as Club Protection Officer and as Vocational Service Director. We are very grateful that he chose to leave the Bethel club and join Oxford Hills. Congratulations, Dan!
