<u>AG Chris</u> — Linda Smith's plan for us to resume in person meetings at the church was approved by the church council so we will be meeting there on Wednesday, July 8th. For those who are still uncomfortable about meeting in person, we plan to continue offering Zoom meetings. Our meetings will be different. The kitchen is off limits, so we will all have to enter and exit through the front door. We will also not be able to have a buffet, but instead will have to line up at the "window" where the coffee usually is and will be served by the kitchen staff there. There may be other requirements as well.

<u>Patty –</u> we have donated \$1,000.00 to the Bridgton-Lake Region Club to support their District Grant for personal hygiene products.

<u>Dan H. –</u> Nicole Carter from the Advertiser is doing a story on how Covid-19 has affected fund raising for organizations such as Rotary and Kiwanis. Peter agreed to talk to her about the Lobster Fest and although Paul wasn't attending, we suggested that she talk to him about the Auction.

Instead, he is going to proceed on his own privately, but if any member would like to help him with this project, they are more than welcome to do so.

<u>Liz</u> - the budget committee has met and is working on a proposed budget for 2020-2021 which will be presented to the club shortly.

Guest Speaker:

Tina introduced John Williams, Executive Director of the Oxford Hills Chamber of Commerce. John has been associated with the Chamber for 22 years and has owned William's Broadcasting for over 30 years. In addition, he is an ordained minister – so is a very busy guy. John said the Chamber represents 13 communities and has over 350 members, both profit and non-profit, at last count. The Chamber will be celebrating its 50th anniversary next year. John said that the Covid-19 shut downs obviously affected all of the members so the Chamber has having to do business in a different manner these days and he has primarily been looking at and for resources to help all member businesses. There are still many challenges to re-opening the economy and that it is more important than ever to keep the lines of communication open. Businesses can always reach out to the Chamber but John said that calling every member has been

a priority through this time. He has been working with the Casino and advocating for them in Augusta. They can't open under the current rule of not having gatherings of more than 50 people. He has also met with Pender Makin from the Maine Dept. of Education about re-opening schools and believes that with all the health and safety protocols in place, schools will be able to re-open in September.
