Lois Strauss introduced our guest speakers, Alice Sammon and Isabel Merhoff. Alice is the founder of the Ripple Effect Project which is a 501c3 she founded to help the Korando Faith Widows and Orphans Group. The KFWOG is a non-governmental organization based in Kisumu, Kenya by Dolfine and Patrick Oliech. KFWOG currently houses over 30 orphans and provides a primary education to over 200 students. It also operates a farm with fishponds for food and income. Of course, we are working on a possible global grant to provide the orphanage and school with a solar powered water pump system for their farm which is on the shores of Lake Victoria. As part of a school mission trip, Isabel went to Kisumu recently and told us about her experiences with the children there and what their needs are.
