Also this year, there were a lot of conflicting events – the Arts Festival, the Fish & Game Yard Sale and a number of other large yard sales in town. Possible ideas for next year and beyond – having the auction inside (4 Seasons), consign food, have the flea market and ticket auction prior to the auction and close both down before the auction starts, perhaps move back to the Fairgrounds, set-up the tents differently, etc. Things to think about.....
