He talked to us about that and about how we can keep our homes and businesses free from pests. Some of the things he told us were not to stack wood next to your home because that attracts mice and ants; keep bird feeders at least 50' away from your home and keep vegetation away from the foundation. A good way to keep vegetation away is to make a 2' boundary around the foundation with crushed rock and put plantings on the other side of that. He also told us that bed bugs are becoming rampant in Maine, especially in the Augusta and Lewiston-Auburn areas. The most important thing is to keep your house clean and not leave any food, including pet food, out in the open.
